Update on Year 2017

(Message from Miles Okumura, Kyodan President)

2017 Giseikai Legislative Assembly highlights. The annual budget increased slightly (slightly more than 1%), with spending projected to be slightly over \$1.3 million. Slightly over \$800,000 of that is assessed to the temples. The Big Island district's share is a bit over one-fourth of that (appr. \$220,000), with Honoka'a temple bearing 5% of the Big Island's share, thus, somewhere in the range of \$11,000 per year.

This begs the question, of course, of what do we get for that contribution? Cost of maintaining headquarters, related business administration (including centralized minister salary payments), and the office of the Bishop have provided us with increased community outreach.
